



White-breasted Nuthatch

White-breasted Nuthatches have a small patch of rust colored feathers under their tails. They spend their winters in Minnesota and can often be seen at bird feeders. They are known to wedge a nut into a crack in tree bark and then peck at it to release the seed. They are one of the few birds that can go down a tree head-first while they look for insects under the bark.
